Healing Prayer: We experienced significant growth in Healing Care Groups in 2023. It's beautiful to see so many new people experiencing healing.

Jennifer Souter - Kids' Pastor

A temptation for us as pastors who lead kids' ministry is that we think our ministries need to be more like Disney than Mr. Rogers. The two kingdoms they built were a result of two visions of the world.

Walt's world was a perfect version of what our world should look like. His world is shiny songs playing everywhere. Every restaurant serves chicken strips and hotdogs. Never any dust, never chipped paint. Excellence and creativity abound. Walt created a world that was an escape from the real world. Fred's world was simple, even plain. His puppets showed wear, and his set grew old along with Fred. Mr. Rogers lived in a neighborhood and showed kids how to navigate through the real world. Both worlds are important! We need them both! We need both kinds of churches in this world.

I've been at McBIC for almost five years now, and McBIC is unlike any other church I have been to. We keep the important things important. We are truly a Mr. Rogers church.

Walt's world is all about connecting kids to fun to entertain them. Mr. Rogers was different. He didn't distract kids from the pain and questions that were making them sad or scared. He looked into the camera and spoke from his heart to theirs. Kids don't need to be entertained as much as they need to be loved and listened to.

That's the value we hold in our kids' ministry. We want to make sure every child is loved and heard. We want them to know that we care more about who they are becoming in Christ than with how many we have each Sunday. How do we do that? RELATIONSHIPS! And we have some of the best leaders around. They serve with such heart and compassion. They are passionate about children; they want them to have a life-transforming experience with Christ and provide long opportunities for kids to become true disciples. Every child is seen through God's eyes as tomorrow's champion for the Gospel. Our leaders—adults and teens—are our greatest asset. I am so grateful for every single one of them.

We go after relationships because that's what we want to instill in our kids about Jesus: He desires that relationship with us. It's not enough just to know about Him—we need to know Him and be with Him. So, we strive to model that.

As we enter 2024, our elementary kids will be wrapping up their three-year journey of being in the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. It's been an awesome journey of discovering God's Big Story that began with creation and continues with the stories that He is still writing in our lives. This also means that, as a team, we will be discerning if we keep this curriculum and go through the entire Bible again or if we use a different curriculum. While curriculum is just a tool, it is an important one, so I ask that you would be in prayer for us as we discern what God has for us in the 2024–2025 school year.

What I do know is that we will continue to be a Mr. Rogers church. We will continue to love and listen to our kids as they navigate the real world around them, which is filled with pain, questions, wonder, and joy. And we will do it all through the power of relationships—relationships with peers, leaders, and most importantly Jesus.



Cody Sherry – High School Pastor

2023 was such a great year for high school youth ministry and for ministry in general! We have seen many new students join our ministry and regular students deepen their faith in amazing ways. I am blown away by the depth, vulnerability, and compassion I see in our students and am so thankful to lead the charge!

Here are a few of the opportunities from 2023 that I'd like to highlight:

SOUTH TEXAS SERVICE TRIP – In July 2023, 32 students and leaders hopped on a plane bound for South Texas. Our destination was a small town outside of McAllen, TX, just 10 minutes north of the Texas-Mexico border. We joined with an organization called Border Perspective, which serves the migrant population along the border while educating "outsiders" about what life on the border is really like. This trip was so much more than getting our hands dirty—we learned so much, gained compassion for a new people group, and came away changed from the experience. This was a huge win for our ministry.

ZETEO/IMPACT – These events, hosted by Salt 'n Light Youth Ministry, are always such a catalyst for growth, both for our leaders and our students! At ZETEO, we learned about God as our Storymaker, the author of everything in our lives. At IMPACT, we dug into John 15 and learned what it really means to "remain" in Jesus' love and care. These events encourage kids to deepen their relationships with Jesus and with others.

HIGH SCHOOL RETREAT – We are coming off an amazing December weekend retreat and still riding the high! Every year, we make this our flagship event, encouraging as many students and leaders as possible to attend. This year, we had 55 people join us for a weekend of outlandish fun, new friendships, and worship and teaching around the theme "YOU ARE WHAT YOU [_____]." We unpacked myths about our identities and learned what it really means to find ourselves wholly identified by God's love.

LEADERSHIP TEAM – I couldn't do ANYTHING I do without the help of my wonderful adult leadership team. They have supported, challenged, and inspired me to make this ministry the best it can be. A huge thank you to each one of them:

Evan Lebo – Middle School Youth Pastor

Each Wednesday night at youth group, our middle school students spend about 20 minutes in small groups sharing life updates, processing what we're learning from scripture, and encouraging and praying for one another. While I enjoy teaching and leading our large group time, the real essence of youth ministry happens in this small group setting. It's where students learn to make faith their own and form caring, accountable relationships with peers and adults. And these groups are entirely led by our amazing team of volunteer leaders!

Recently one of our leaders – we'll call him Josh – couldn't make it on a Wednesday night, so I hopped in to lead his small group's discussion. Seeing that I was joining the group, one of the students asked me, "What are you doing here?"

"I'm filling in for Josh tonight since he can't be here – I've got big shoes to fill," I said. Without missing a beat, the student replied, "Josh is awesome. You could never fill his shoes. He even came and watched me in my baseball tournament this weekend!"

Our volunteer leaders are integral in helping students mature as followers of Jesus, and I am so thankful for them! They're fans at adolescent activities, but they're also guides on the journey of faith that our middle schoolers are navigating. When students grow up and move on from youth ministry, they probably won't remember much of the "content" that was shared with them. But they will certainly remember the people who were there for them each and every week and the way those people – our leaders – encouraged, challenged, and cared for them.

I couldn't do my job without these people. Be sure to thank a youth leader next time you see one!

Middle School Ministry Highlights of 2023:

- Local Service Day. In late March, our students spent a day volunteering with some organizations that serve our local community. With some spare time after serving, a handful of students baked and prepared the communion supplies to be used that Sunday morning. The community service was meaningful, but I saw this particular moment as a beautiful picture of the way McBIC values the presence and input of our young people!
- Middle School Retreat. "The Table" was our theme for the weekend, where we talked about how our relationship with God a "seat at the table" is not earned but gifted. No behavior will make God love us any less or any more; we are beloved children and heirs of God. By putting our faith and trust in Jesus, we get to sit at the communion table with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It was a special weekend!
- **Sabbatical.** I've shared other places about the details of my sabbatical, so here I just want to say, "Thank you!" for being a church community that values the professional and personal health of our staff. It was a very refreshing time for me.

HomeGroup — Our young adults spent the first half of 2023 exploring our God-given gifts, and this fall, we focused on the images used in scripture to represent the Holy Spirit. We currently have about 25 young adults attending HomeGroup on a regular basis, including single adults in their 20s and 30s, college students, and married couples. These groups have been wonderful opportunities for our young adults to grow in their faith together and to pray for each other. Thank you to Michael Snader and Conrad Martin for their leadership and to Melanie Miller and family, whose childcare allows our young adults parents to engage in HomeGroup.

LargeGroup – During our series on discovering our gifts, our young adults heard from people throughout McBIC about the ways they use their God-given gifts to bless others. This fall, we heard testimonies from other McBIC folks about how they have experienced and responded to the Holy Spirit. These gatherings have been great opportunities for our young adults to worship together and learn from the experiences of our McBIC community. Thank you to everyone who has volunteered to share and lead worship for these gatherings!

Annual Retreat, Second Saturday, and Family Dinner – This year, we incorporated more times of fellowship, like fun outings and dinner together once a month, which has allowed our young adults to get to know each other better and develop friendships with one another. Our annual retreat in May was a wonderful weekend together as we played games, shared meals, worshiped together, and had extended times devoted to praying with and for each other.

First Impressions – Our ministry team has expanded this year with new volunteers serving as greeters, Coffee Corner servers, and Messiah van drivers. We have also added volunteers at the Connection Center during the 11 a.m. service, which allows me the opportunity to join our congregation for worship and the message. I am incredibly thankful for the ways our volunteers and McBIC community extend hospitality to the individuals and families who continue to visit and make McBIC their church home!

Another highlight from 2023 was the creation of a McBIC Sermons podcast, which allows people to listen to each week's sermon on Spotify and Apple Podcasts! I also continue to pursue my master's degree in clinical mental health counseling through Messiah University. As I look ahead to 2024, I am eager to discover what God has in store for each of these areas of ministry and for the people involved. Annual Church Board Report

Church Board Meeting Minutes

February 4, 2024

Please accept the following report as a summary of decisions made by the Church Board in 2023 on behalf of the McBIC congregation.

Current Board Members: Layne Lebo (Chair), Chris Earley (Assistant Chair), Gabi Fish, Shawn Greenland, Lili Hagenbuch, Mitch Martin, John Matanguihan, Derek Mauldin (Treasurer), Harmony Petty (Secretary), Kristen Slabaugh

Facility Projects

- a. The worship center lighting was replaced in April due to a voltage issue.
- b. Paving, repair, and sealing of the circle and parking lot was completed in July with a significant portion of the costs covered by the Auto Auction.
- c. All kitchens were painted in November epoxy flooring will also be completed in the coming months.

2. Staffing Overview

- a. A Worship Ministry Task Force was established and met during the first three months of 2023 to discuss the future direction of the worship ministry and to compose a worship pastor job description.
- b. Evan Lebo took a sabbatical from mid-May to mid-August with successful coverage from other pastors.
- c. An office assistant position (approximately 12 hours/week) was posted in October. Melanie Miller was hired for this position in November.
- d. The Board and Worship Ministry Task Force met with Evan and Lauren Lebo in October to discuss the potential of Evan becoming the next worship pastor. An interview was conducted with members of the Board and Task Force in late October, and the Board approved his hire in November.
- 3. McBIC Financial Reporting The Board continues to rely on the expertise of Derek Mauldin and Shawn Greenland, who provide detailed monthly financial reports and guidance regarding McBIC's expenses and annual trends.
 - a. 2023 Giving McBIC ended the year with income exceeding expenses, with a surplus of \$10,457.84.
 - b. The end-of-year fundraising campaign for One80 Ministries and BIC U.S. World Missions (missionary care) was successful with \$22,750.94 raised by our church

family and an additional \$2,249.06 added from our end-of-year surplus for a total of \$25,000.

4. Safety and Security

- a. A Safety and Security Task Force met during early 2023. This team developed safety and security guidelines and implemented various security measures around the facility, including the installation of a front door lock/security system and lockdown procedures for children's ministry areas.
- b. A mental health first aid training was held in April for staff and volunteers.
- c. An active intruder training was held in October.

The Church Board appreciates the opportunity to serve this congregation and all your prayers and support.

Electronic Giving

Planning Center (Church Center) offers a variety of giving options ranging from one-time, weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly and includes deduction options for bank account, debit, or credit cards. Keep in mind that credit or debit card donations incur a fee of 2.15% plus \$0.30 per donation whereas ACH bank transfer donations will incur a fee of \$0.30 per donation.
